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
## Service Delivery System

### Referral and Access Points

Stabilization Center, Assessment and Referral Center (ARC), Hospitals, Syringe Service Programs, FEMS Co-Response Teams, DBH Community Response Team, Access Helpline

#### **Support Services**

Syringe Service Programs, Naloxone Program, Social Marketing Strategies, Fentanyl Test Strips. Stabilization Center.

4 Prevention Centers, Faith-based Entities

#### **Treatment Services**

Incorporate ASAM levels of care across continuum, Adult Residential Facilities, Outpatient Substance Use Providers,, FQHCs, Medication for Opioid Use Disorders, Opioid Treatment Providers



Peer Operated Centers Recovery Housing, Care Coordination Services, Recovery Coaching and Mentoring, Life Skills Support, Education Support Services, Transportation (public), Environmental Stability, Supported Employment

#### **DC Crisis Stabilization Center**



Improves Access to immediate care, stabilizes, and transitions clients to on-going services



Enhances neighborhood safety with support for those in crisis
